We are excited to announce our second season of guest speakers at Goodell Gardens! Five local experts will share their specialized knowledge and skills related to a variety of nature-related topics. These sessions will feature informative presentations, engaging make-and-take demonstrations, and numerous opportunities to ask questions and connect with like-minded people.

- •June 20 Herbalism and Tinctures Leslie Alexander | Local Herbal Allies for Medicine Making: There are many medicinal herbs that grow in northwestern Pennsylvania. Dozens are available to support health and wellness, and the solstice is a fine time to explore what is thriving as we move into summer. This workshop will include a short stroll as we identify local herbal allies, explore their growth habitats, and their appearances. We will also learn about the varied safe and effective ways in which we can work with these herbs in our homes to stock an herbal medicine chest.
- July 18 Gardening, Nature, and Spirituality Rev. Jenn Shepherd | Rooted in Nature: Cultivating Wellness and Renewal: Immerse yourself in an exploration of our deep connection to nature in this enlightening talk. From embracing nature as home to renewing our planet and ourselves, discover the transformative power of gardening and the therapeutic benefits it offers. Engage in a hands-on container gardening tutorial and a guided meditation experience, while delving into the wellness benefits of nature. Join the discussion and share your insights as we celebrate the profound synergy between humanity and the natural world, cultivating a shared vision for harmony and renewal. August 1 Regenerative Farming Caleb Schenk | Healing Communities, the Earth, and Our Souls through Regenerative Agriculture: We hear the words sustainable, ethical, ecological, green, carbon neutral, etc. frequently these days. What if rather than buying a new car-or switching over to the new advertised way of reducing our carbon footprint—we just need to go back to the basics? Regenerative agriculture is the only carbon negative, natural food production system that reduces carbon in the atmosphere and produces nutritionally dense food at the same time. This workshop will include time for questions and answers as well as a brief walk to discuss the process of biomass accumulation and the various functions of things that our culture calls "weeds."
- -August 22 Backyard Bat Conservation Dr. Steve $Ropski \mid \underline{Bats: Mythology}$ and $\underline{Reality}$: Learn about the important role bats play in our society as we explore such topics as food habits, reproduction, hibernation, White Nose Syndrome, and their conservation status. We will also search the grounds for any roosting bats and mark them if possible.

•September 12 **Growing Mushrooms Indoors** *Eric Laughery* | <u>Growing Oyster Mushrooms at Home & Basics of Indoor Mushroom Cultivation</u>: This workshop will focus on the easiest and most efficient ways to grow mushrooms inside with minimal equipment. We will demonstrate how to grow different colored oyster mushrooms on straw. Highlighted topics will include spore vs culture, spawn runs, secondary substrates, the colonization period, the outgrowing stage, and harvesting/composting. With its focus on growing edible fungi indoors, this program will complement the topic of outdoor cultivation and foraging.




