





Arlene Horsclaw is out of prison, paroled after spending eight years following a murder conviction. Her eight years did not go easy, and Arlene spent much of her time in solitary confinement. As Arlene tries to adjust to life on the outside, memories of her criminal past "Arlie" force their way in. She remembers a vicious and angry child who killed frogs for fun and beat up other kids.
